

ANMK LOCAL COMMUNITY REGULAR EXCURSION RISK ASSESSMENT

PURPOSE

Committee members and staff have developed this document with a view to regular monitor and update this document. Ideas, recommendations, and concerns which are not already addressed in this document are welcomed and participants are encouraged to contact the kindergarten with any views on this document. This document is not intended to apply to Bush Kinder.

LOCAL COMMUNITY REGULAR OUTING DETAILS

- **Program:** Alfred Nuttall Memorial Kindergarten 3YO and 4YO kindergarten program – local community walking outings/excursions.
- **Excursion Details:** regular excursions may involve any of the following:
 - Walking from the ANMK Home Kinder Site to Breavington Park (situated between Plimsoll Gve and Hall St, Fairfield), spending time at Breavington Park and walking back to Home Kinder.
 - Walking to and from the letter box on the corner of Perry St and Rayment St in Fairfield.
 - Walking the block comprising Separation St, Sparks Ave, Perry St and McGregor St in Fairfield.
 - Walking to Fairfield Primary School or Fairfield Library
- **Times:** At various times within the 3 YO and 4YO program session times as and when educational staff feel it is appropriate and in the children's interest to do so. It is expected that outings may take between 15 minutes and 2 hours depending on the destination and purpose.
(N.B. Monday-Friday 8.30am to 4pm in Victorian school terms)
- **Means of Transport:** Walking
- **Process for exiting and entering Home Kinder:** All children to be checked for identification wristbands and head count conducted prior to leaving the building. Each child to be assigned and communicated a buddy child for the duration of excursion and reminded of rules and expectations while on excursion. Head counts to be conducted immediately upon arrival back at Home Kinder.
- **Responsible Staff in Charge:** Susie Alston (Director, Nominated Supervisor and Teacher) or otherwise the Teacher in charge of the session.
- **Supervision:** The adult to child ratio for the local community regular excursions will operate at a minimum of 1:9 (inclusive of parent/adult volunteers), with the number of educational staff in attendance sufficient to ensure the regulatory minimum educational staff ratio of 1:11 is always met. Parents, guardians or other adult relatives are permitted to participate if:
 - they have a valid and current working with children's check and have provided evidence of this to ANMK in advance;
 - they have read and understand the Volunteer Guidelines circulated to families at the start of each year;
 - they have returned a signed copy of the ANMK Code of Conduct;
 - they are rostered on for parent duty or have agreed participation with the teacher in charge; and

- **Number in attendance:** Up to 27 ANMK kindergarten children may be in attendance (depending on the attendance level of the group on any given day). Siblings are not permitted to attend alongside a parent/guardian or other adult relative.

REGULAR EXCURSION CHECKLIST

The following items to be readily available during the excursion:

- First Aid Kit
- List of children involved in the excursion
- Contact information for each child
- Medication, health plan & risk assessment for relevant individual children
- List of adults involved in the excursion
- Contact information for each adult
- Mobile phone (means of communicating with the service and emergency services)
- Each child to be wearing:
 - o ANMK identification silicon wrist band or tape with number on;
 - o closed toe shoes;
 - o clothing appropriate for the weather (including HAT and sunscreen if UV is forecast to be above 3)
- If the length of excursion warrants it, each child's water bottles and snack.

RISK REGISTER

The risks assessed below apply to the operation of the local community regular excursions taking place in the streets surrounding the ANMK Home Site. In the event an identified risk actually occurs, the below register outlines action required to be taken. Once actioned, consideration must be given as to whether VMIA should be contacted for advice and management of the incident and, for moderate/major events, an incident report and notification should be lodged with DET.

This original risk assessment for ANMK's local community excursions was undertaken in September 2020 by the ANMK Committee and updated in March 2021 & September 2022. It was last reviewed in October 2023. The risk assessment is to be formally reviewed in March and August each year by the 3YO and 4YO Teachers and ANMK Quality Standards Subcommittee, but subject to continual consideration and monitoring by the staff team.
